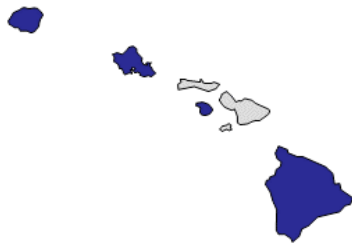

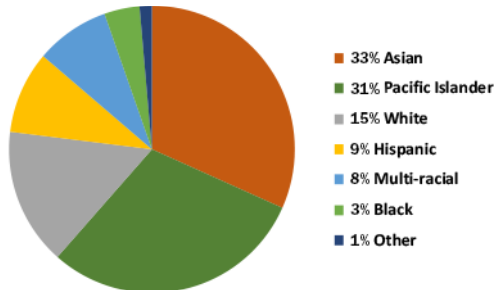

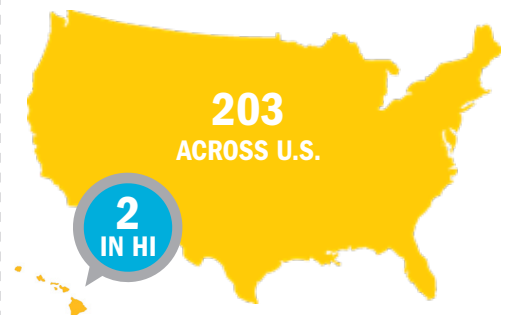

AVID National Demonstration Schools



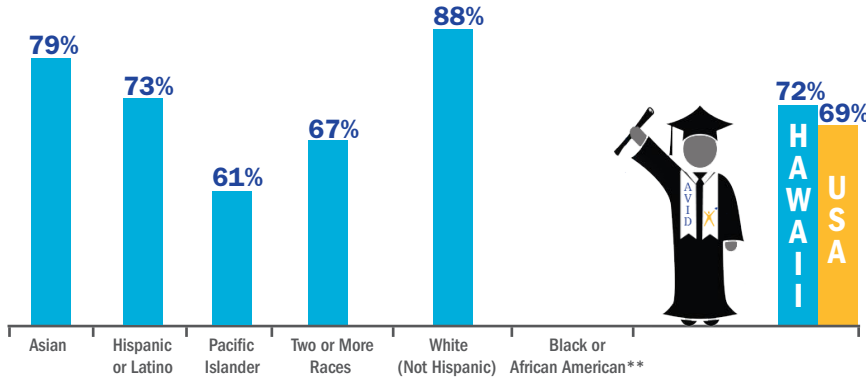

AVID Hawaii – Closing the Achievement Gap for College Enrollment

Enrollment* at Two- or Four-Year Colleges

Overall, 72% of AVID's 2016–17 Hawaii seniors immediately enrolled in college the first fall term after high school, a rate that is higher than all Hawaii graduates (55%) and U.S. graduates (69%) from the same year.

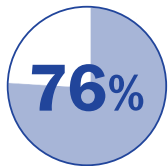
