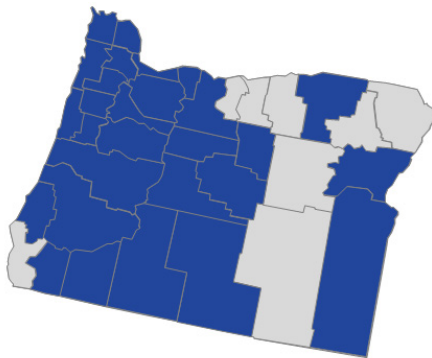

Goals of AVID's College Readiness System

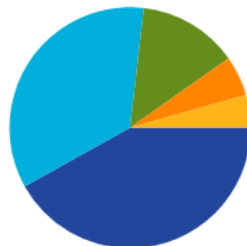
- Accelerate under-achieving students who have potential into more rigorous courses
